Brief Description of Course What will the course cover?	The course will improve your speaking and listening, reading and writing at Entry 1 and will give you the confidence to speak and communicate in English. Topics covered may include talking about you, your friends and family, your local area and your free time. You will also practice your numeracy, ICT and citizenship skills.		
Entry Requirements	You will need to have Entry Level speaking, listening, reading and writing skills.		
Main Learning Outcomes for all Learners (Maximum of 5) By the end of the course you will be able to:			
1	Ask and answer 4 questions about everyday life.		
2	Talk about own family for 1 minute.		
3	Say 3 things you like about a picture giving reasons why.		
4	Listen to a recording and answer 2 questions about it.		
5	Give a presentation about yourself for 1 minute.

What examination or assessment will there be and what will it involve?

You will sit the ESOL Entry 1 Speaking and Listening exam at the end of the course. You will also be set goals by your tutor.

Please note on all examination courses, it is a requirement that you provide photographic proof of ID. This is for external awarding body and internal invigilation authentication purposes.

How will I know I am making progress?

You will have tutorials where you can talk to your tutor about your work and will sit a practice exam.

Is there anything else I need to know?

Please remember if you miss 3 classes in a row or you attendance is below 90%, you will lose your place on the course. When attending class, you must bring to class all equipment to study (pens, paper, dictionary etc).

You must do your homework and any other tasks that your tutor asks you to do to enable you to achieve your learning goals. If you do not, then your tutor can remove you from the course.

If you cannot finish the course, you must tell your tutor as soon as possible. If you cannot attend an exam that you have been entered for, then you will be liable to pay £50.
