Course Title	Batik on Fabric for Summer		
Level of Course	All levels	Course Code	C3084
Duration	1 x 2.5 hour session		
Brief Description of Course	<p>This course provides a basic introduction to using Batik. You will be introduced to the different techniques, mediums used, cultures who use it and terminology commonly used.</p> <p>During the day you will prepare a design for a piece of fabric, a T-Shirt or bag.</p> <p>You will be encouraged to develop an inventive and personal approach to your work. You will be able to discuss colour theory and mix dyes referring to a colour wheel. Use techniques such as pattern enlargement and symmetry. You will be able to experiment with resist techniques, dyes and use painting techniques such as wet in wet and ombre.</p> <p>By the end of the day you will have a final piece to take home with you.</p>

2	Use resist techniques for dyeing or painting using wax

5	Produce a design or composition in batik		
Equipment Required What will I need to bring to class?	<p>Some fabric for Batik will be supplied. However you may wish to bring cotton garments lengths of cotton fabric or cotton bags if you wish.</p> <p>Notebook, sketchbook and file for hand-outs</p>
