Course Title	Beaded Jewellery

Brief Description of Course	<p>During the course you will be introduced to the craft of jewellery beading. You will be able to make your own jewellery, or jewellery for gifts. .</p> <p>This course will cover jewellery design techniques, jewellery beading and wire work where wire is wrapped around gemstones to secure them in place.</p> <p>You will also explore the use of colours in pattern repeats, unusual accessories from different cultures and the work of other jewellery designers for inspiration.</p> <p>This is a short five week course by the end of the course you will have learnt enough techniques and developed your bead-craft skills to make a piece of jewellery such as a necklace, a bracelet or or a matching pair of earrings.</p>

1	Produce a piece of beaded or wire work jewellery		
2	Use counting skills to apply pattern to jewellery		
3	Select appropriate techniques such as: wire twisting, weaving or threading		
4	Use different cultures and the work of jewellery designers for inspiration.		
5	Speak confidently about your work using professional terminology

What courses can I go on to?	You can continue with the course to progress your own work. You will have the opportunity to discuss with your tutor your individual progression route. Your tutor will help you research other courses in and outside of Idea Store Learning.		

What examination or assessment will there be and what will it involve?

At the beginning of the course an initial assessment takes place to identify your level of experience knowledge or current skills.

The tutor will carry out informal assessments to check your understanding, there is no exam.

You will complete a self-assessment at the beginning and end of the course.

Your tutor will let you know how you are getting on throughout the course to you will help you work to your full potential.

At the end of the course you will receive written feedback.

How will I know I am making progress?

You will have an 'Individual Learning Plan' where the course learning outcomes are shown and where you can set individual learning goals and monitor your own progress against these.

You will need to evaluate your own progress and manage your time.

Your tutor will give ongoing feedback and will keep you informed of your progress.
