Brief Description of Course	This is a short course over five weeks. On the course you will prepare your work ready to photograph and research various social media platforms to upload it to.		
	You will consider the pro's and cons of these platforms e.g. costs versus free sites, and include popular sites such as: esty, facebook, pin interest and blogs.		
	You will write a personal statement to promote yourself and consider other methods of self- promotion		
	Consider branding and learn how search engines find you. You will participate in group discussions and develop your ideas through peer review and gain a general understanding of business types e.g. Ltd, Sole Trader, Freelance, Plc., Health and Safety and other necessary legislation.		
Entry Requirements	You should have some of your own artwork to photograph that you would like to sell and be reasonably IT literate.

1	Research a range of media platforms and consider what each offer and select an appropriate promotional platform for your work		
2	Write a personal statement to support your work		
3	Have a basic understanding of a variety of business types

At the end of the course you will receive written feedback.

How will I know I am making progress?

You will have an 'Individual Learning Plan' where the course learning outcomes are shown and where you can set individual learning goals and monitor your own progress against these.

You will need to evaluate your own progress and manage your time.

Your tutor will give ongoing feedback and will keep you informed of your progress.
