Course Title	Tie Dye on Fabric for Summer

Duration	1 x 2.5 hour session		
Brief Description of Course	<p>This course provides an introduction to different techniques and mediums using tie dye.</p> <p>You will be introduced to resist techniques such as knotting and tying. You will be shown examples of how tie dye is used in different cultures and use as an inspiration for your own work. You will be encouraged to develop inventive and personal approaches to producing your own design.</p> <p>You will create a final piece using methods learned on a piece of fabric a bag or T- shirt.</p>

1	Use primary, secondary colour mixing		
2	Use resist techniques for dyeing such as knotting and folding

4	Discuss cultures that use tie-dye such as Shibori and Polynesian sarong designs		
5	Produce a tie dyed piece of fabric or garment		
Equipment Required What will I need to bring to class?	<p>Basic materials will be provided.</p> <p>You may wish to bring a cotton T-shirt or cotton bags to dye.</p> <p>You should also bring a notebook or sketchbook a file for hand-outs. Clothes suitable for protection as dyeing fabric can be messy.</p>
