Brief Description of Course What will the course cover?	This course will develop your ability to speak, listen, read and write in everyday contexts. You will be able to handle most situations likely to arise while travelling in an area where the language is spoken. The course is interactive and topics based on everyday life and current issues. You will also develop your use of regular and irregular verbs, use past and future tenses, conditional tenses and express opinions with great ease.		
Entry Requirements	You should have completed French Pre-Intermediate Part 2 or 100 hours of previous study.		
Main Learning Outcomes for all Learners (Maximum of 5) By the end of the course you will be able to:			
1	Discuss the mass media and TV programmes, current affairs, advertising and the press, expressing opinions		
2	Discuss well-being and healthy lifestyles		
3	Make complex sentences using connectives		
4	Talk about present, past and future activities and use if clauses		
5	Identify some of the cultural aspects of the French speaking world and recognise the similarities and differences with your own culture

What courses can I go on to?	You can progress to French Intermediate Part 1 .		

What examination or assessment will there be and what will it involve?

There is no examination with this course.

A tutor conducted initial assessment will be followed by on-going assessment of progress and achievement. There will be two controlled assessments, first one on the 5th week and the 2nd one on the 10th week.

How will I know I am making progress?

Your tutor will give you continuous feedback on your oral and written work as well as suggestions for improvement. You will have an individual learning plan to monitor your own progress. The tutor will keep a record of your work and performance and discuss this with you. You will gain more from the course if you commit study time to it outside the classroom.

Is there anything else I need to know?

We expect you to attend all classes, be on time and complete any homework given by your tutor
