Brief Description of Course What will the course cover?	This course will cover pre intermediate German in an interactive way. You will learn how to speak, listen, read and write. The primary focus in sessions will be on speaking and listening and you will be expected to participate. Reading and writing will predominantly be set as homework activities which you are expected to complete.		
Entry Requirements	This course is suitable for those who have completed approximately 100 hours of tuition or equivalent.		
Main Learning Outcomes for all Learners (Maximum of 5) By the end of the course you will be able to:			
1	Talking about personal experience using past tenses and making plans for the future.		
2	Listen for detail using key words to extract specific information from a longer spoken passage (e.g. news).		
3	Skim and scan a short formal text e.g. online text, news headlines		
4	Write an informal email/letter giving a short description of an event, expressing and justifying opinions.		
5	Talk about cultural and social interaction		
Equipment Required What will I need to bring to class?	You will need to your enrolment slip to the first session as well as a note book, pen and folder. The course is based on the tutor's resources which are accessible on MOODLE, the Idea Store's VLE.		
What courses can I go on to?	Your tutor will advise on suitable progression as this is currently the highest level of German offered at Idea Store Learning.		

What examination or assessment will there be and what will it involve?

There is no examination with this course.

A tutor conducted initial assessment will be followed by on-going assessment of progress and achievement.

How will I know I am making progress?

The tutor will give you continuous feedback on your oral and written work as well as suggestions for improvement. You will have an individual learning plan to monitor your own progress. The tutor will keep a record of your work and performance and discuss this with you. You will gain more from the course if you commit study time to it outside the classroom.
