

## Course Description and Outline

<b>Course Title</b>	Digital Photography - Intermediate		
<b>Level of Course</b>	Intermediate	<b>Course Code</b>	A4092
<b>Duration in Weeks</b>	10		
<b>Brief Description of Course What will the course cover?</b>	On our Digital Photography- Intermediate course you will build on skills learnt on the Basic Digital Photography course. You will be learning how to work with: raw images, use your on camera flash, be able to set up studio flash lighting equipment, explore different lighting types, and develop an appreciation of composition in photographic images from a diverse range of sources.		
<b>Entry Requirements</b>	Ideally you will have attended the Get to Know your Digital Camera and the Basic Digital Photography course at Idea Store Learning. You will need to have your own digital camera that has manual controls and be able to operate it using those manual controls. The Digital Photography Intermediate course is the last course in a series that comprises of: Get to Know your DSLR Camera, Basic Digital Photography and Digital Photography Intermediate. These three courses will give you the tools to make photographs with confidence across a wide range of picture making situations. You will need to have a camera that can be used in manual mode, i.e .a Compact, Bridge or DSLR camera.		
<b>Main Learning Outcomes for all Learners (Maximum of 5) By the end of the course you will be able to:</b>			
<b>1</b>	Use raw images as part of your digital image workflow for your digital photography.		
<b>2</b>	Discuss how you have used composition in your photographs to make meaningful images with perspectives from a diverse range of sources.		
<b>3</b>	Use your on camera flash, to make correctly exposed flash images.		
<b>4</b>	See light from a range of different types of lighting sources, enabling you to work effectively with these (light sources) to make compelling photographs.		
<b>5</b>	Use photographic Studio Flash and /or Tungsten lighting to create photographic images.		
<b>Equipment Required What will I need to bring to class?</b>	DSLR Camera, Pen & notepaper diary or log book to record own progress and make notes during theory sessions and practical demonstrations.		

<p><b>What courses can I go on to?</b></p>	<p>Idea Store Learning photography department recommends that you will have developed the skills that would enable you to attend any of the following courses: Develop a photography Project, Portrait and Studio Photography, or other photography courses.</p>
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<p><b>What examination or assessment will there be and what will it involve?</b></p>
<p>Please note on all examination courses, it is a requirement that you provide photographic proof of ID. This is for external awarding body and internal invigilation authentication purposes.</p> <p>There will be an initial assessment, followed by on-going assessment of progress and achievement. This course will also include: showing/presentation of your photographs to fellow students. Discussion of photographic images using appropriate photographic terminology. Ongoing tutor assessment of your photographic knowledge and skills.</p>
<p><b>How will I know I am making progress?</b></p>
<p>Your tutor will give you on-going feedback tracking and monitoring your progress, giving feedback though out the course. You and the tutor will use an individual learning plan to monitor your progress allowing you and the tutor to track your knowledge and skills developed on the course. You will also gain more from the course if you commit time to it outside the classroom.</p>
<p><b>Is there anything else I need to know?</b></p>
<p>Punctuality in attendance on courses is important to us, as students who arrive late interrupt the learning experience for all learners.</p> <p>In general, we will not allow late entry to any course after the first two weeks. Short intensive courses and most workshops will not accept new learners after the first class. In all cases the full fee will be charged.</p>
