Brief Description of Course What will the course cover?	This course will help you become more confident when using English grammar and prepare you for Entry 3 ESOL courses. We will explore different grammatical structures and uses. This will help improve accuracy in your speaking and writing skills, and comprehension when listening and reading.		
Entry Requirements	You should have completed ESOL Entry level 2 or be able to demonstrate language of the required level.		
Main Learning Outcomes for all Learners. By the end of the course you will be able to:			
1	Write and talk about a past event using the past simple and adjectives.		
2	Take part in a discussion on a subject which is important to you (life in the UK, learning English), give your opinions and ask other people their opinions.		
3	Write a description of a place you have visited using adjectives, but, so and because.		
4	Read a short story and write a review.		
Equipment Required What will I need to bring to class?	You need to bring your own folder, notebook, and pen to each class.		
What courses can I go on to?	Brush up your Grammar to ESOL Entry 3 part C, or IT for ESOL.
