Course Title	Family Learning Maths (Term B)		
Level of Course	Entry 2/3	Course Code	B8125
Duration in Weeks	10 weeks		
Brief Description of Course What will the course cover?	<p>In this course you will learn about what maths skills are expected of children in primary school with a focus on what they will be learning when they move to Key Stage 2.</p> <p>You will be practising different methods for carrying out the 4 operations, solving money problems, calculating with time.</p> <p>You will be introduced to maths games and free resources to get ideas on how to support your child's maths skills at home.</p>		
Entry Requirements	This course is open to all parents and carers with basic maths skills on entry to course (entry level 2) who are willing to learn how to support their child better.		
Main Learning Outcomes for all Learners (Maximum of 5) By the end of the course you will have:			
1	carried out subtraction on a number-line to calculate exact change when shopping (counting on);		
2	practised multiplication and division by 10, 100, 1000 using a place value slider;		
3	learnt the grid method to perform written multiplication.		
Equipment Required What will I need to bring to class?	Pen, pencil, calculator, ruler, protractor, notebook or folder with writing paper (preferably A4 square paper).		
What courses can I go on to?	Other family learning courses for parents and children, or Functional Skills maths courses. You could also choose to boost your English or ICT skills, or try to learn an altogether new skill e.g. photography. Please see our Course Prospectus or speak to your course tutor.		

What examination or assessment will there be and what will it involve?

There is no formal assessment or examination on this course.

You will have plenty of opportunity, though, to self-assess and discuss your knowledge and skills with the tutor.

You will have multiple opportunities for self-assessment in a supportive and fun family learning environment. Your tutor will be providing you with feedback and ideas for further work throughout the course.
