Brief Description of Course What will the course cover?	<p>The aim of this course is to enable you to produce a high standard of work for exhibition, competition, and sale or for employment to help you raise your profile in the creative industries sector.</p> <p>This course is suitable for you if you already have existing Stained Glass making skills and would like to develop these further.</p> <p>You will have the opportunity to develop your own work and creative ideas in a vibrant and supportive atmosphere with access to a wide range of stained glass making equipment and materials.</p>		
Entry Requirements	You must have completed at least 25 hours on one of our all levels stained glass courses within the last three years or hold an equivalent level of knowledge and skills.		
Main Learning Outcomes for all Learners (Maximum of 5) By the end of the course you will be able to:			
1	Make full use of the Craft room and equipment to develop your work to a professional standard;		
2	Produce a portfolio of work for exhibition, competition or for sale;		
3	Write a personal statement to support your work;		
4	Explore potential channels for selling your work such as exhibitions, market stalls or on line sales;		
5	Make connections with other stained glass artists.		
Equipment Required What will I need to bring to class?	We will provide all the basic materials but you will need to provide your own specialist materials, as directed by the tutor.		
What courses can I go on to?	<p>You may wish to enrol on other courses held at Idea Store Learning. Please see a course guide for further information or speak with your tutor.</p> <p>Your tutor will support you in researching these and other courses outside of Idea Store Learning.</p>		

What examination or assessment will there be and what will it involve?

There is no exam or formal assessment at the end of the course, but your tutor will give you regular feedback on your progress. You will also have an Individual Learning Plan, which you will use to keep track of your progress.

At the beginning of the course an initial assessment takes place to identify your level of experience knowledge or current skills.

You will complete a self-assessment at the beginning, middle and end of the course and you will participate in regular self-assessment.

Your tutor will let you know how you are getting on throughout the course, to help you work to your full potential.

At the end of the course you will receive written feedback.

How will I know I am making progress?

You will have an 'Individual Learning Plan' where the course learning outcomes are shown and where you can set individual learning goals and monitor your own progress against these.

You will need to evaluate your own progress and manage your time.

Your tutor will give ongoing feedback and will keep you informed of your progress.

Is there anything else I need to know?

To maximise your chances of benefiting from the course fully we expect you to attend **all scheduled sessions** and that you do so **punctually** and are ready to start learning at the start of the class.
