Course Title	Beaded Jewellery

Brief Description of Course	<p>During the course you will be introduced to the craft of jewellery beading where you will be able to make jewellery such as a necklace, a bracelet or perhaps a matching pair of earrings if time allows.</p> <p>This course will cover jewellery design techniques, jewellery beading and wire work.</p> <p>You will also explore the use of different colours, unusual accessories from different cultures and the work of jewellery designers for inspiration.</p> <p>This is a short five week course by the end of the course you will have learnt enough techniques and developed your beadcraft skills to make a piece of jewellery.</p>

2	Use counting skills to apply your own pattern to a piece of jewellery

4	Use colour theory, different cultures and the work of jewellery designers for inspiration.		
5	Speak confidently about your work using professional terminology

What examination or assessment will there be and what will it involve?

The tutor will carry out informal assessments to check your understanding, there is no exam.

You will complete a self-assessment at the beginning and end of the course.

Your tutor will let you know how you are getting on throughout the course to you will help you work to your full potential.

At the end of the course you will receive written feedback.

How will I know I am making progress?

You will have an 'Individual Learning Plan' where the course learning outcomes are shown and where you can set individual learning goals and monitor your own progress against these.

You will need to evaluate your own progress and manage your time.

Your tutor will give ongoing feedback and will keep you informed of your progress.
