| <b>Brief Description of Course</b>  | <p>This is a beginner's course; you do not need any previous experience. You should have an interest in painting and drawing.</p> <p>This 10 week course provides a thorough introduction to painting in oil and covers basic techniques such as colour mixing; how to use colour; the purpose of neutral and complimentary colours; preparing canvas; scale and composition and drawing from sketches and photographs.</p> <p>Whilst on the course you will work towards completing an oil painting.</p> |                    |                        |
