Brief Description of Course What will the course cover?	<p>This course is for you if you have an interest in how space, colour, textiles, furniture all work together in interior design to form a cohesive look.</p> <p>The course is at intermediate level and will help you develop your basic skills in interior design.</p> <p>You will learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> How to plan 3D layouts; work in your own style; prepare models; use scale and proportion and plan professional layouts. <p>You will continue to develop your knowledge and understanding of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A range of interior design techniques; the principles of colour theory; how different cultures have inspired interior design; use specific design terminology; use publications about interior design. 		
Entry Requirements	This is a follow on for Introduction to Interior Design course or equivalent learning.		
Main Learning Outcomes for all Learners (Maximum of 5) By the end of the course you will be able to:			
1	Be more confident and knowledgeable about a range of interior design techniques		
2	Produce 3D room plans to scale		
3	Work to a specific brief or project.

Equipment Required What will I need to bring to class?	All basic materials are provided. If you wish to build up your own art kit as the course progresses you may need to purchase some of your own materials. You may also want to use particular fabrics, wallpaper, colours, patterns, magazine cut outs etc., for your mood board or design, which you will need to purchase. If you wish you may also like to keep your inspiration and record of your work in an A4 sketchbook/or folder. It could also be helpful to wear old clothes.
