Brief Description of Course What will the course cover?	The course is designed to introduce you to the learning environment and its facilities, key staff and their responsibilities, what to do in case of a fire and other health and safety issues. You will take part in an educational trip and get to know the other learners in your class. You will practice speaking, listening, reading and writing and work individually, in pairs and small groups.		
Entry Requirements	Pre Entry Level 1 speaking, listening, reading and writing.		
Main Learning Outcomes for all Learners (Maximum of 5) By the end of the course you will be able to:			
1	Be familiar with your learning centre, its facilities, key members of staff and be able to identify main health and safety procedures.		
2	Have an awareness of safeguarding, British values and the prevent campaign.		
3	Work with all members of the class and learn everyone's name.		
4	Use present simple tense to talk about daily routine and likes and dislikes.		
5	Plan and take part in a trip. Complete a short project in class based on trip.		
Equipment Required What will I need to bring to class?	Learners need to provide their own folders, pens and English dictionaries.		
What courses can I go on to?	ESOL Entry 1 accredited (speaking and listening or reading and writing), Functional skills (maths and English), ICT courses or a non accredited ESOL course (health and wellbeing or accessing local services).		

What examination or assessment will there be and what will it involve?

There is no examination for this course. If you are of the correct level you will progress to an accredited Speaking and Listening course in January '16 with exams in July '16.

Please note on all examination courses, it is a requirement that you provide photographic proof of ID. This is for external awarding body and internal invigilation authentication purposes.

How will I know I am making progress?

Your tutor will inform you of your progress and you will keep your learning diary. You will also complete regular progress reviews with your tutor.

Is there anything else I need to know?

Please remember if you miss 3 classes in a row or your attendance is below 90%, you will lose your place on the course. When attending class, you must bring to class all equipment to study (pens, paper, dictionary etc.).

You must do your homework and any other tasks that your tutor asks you to do to enable you to achieve your learning goals. If you do not, then your tutor can remove you from the course.
