What will the course cover?

- Formal and informal register orally and in writing
- Set phrases to communicate by phone and in writing
- Expressing pleasure, condolence, agreement and disagreement, apologising, likes and dislikes
- Extended use of present regular and irregular verbs
- Simple uses of past tenses (regular and most common irregular verbs) and their concordance
- Simple use of future (regular and most common irregular verbs)
- Talk about leisure activities, regular activities and work, using different time frames
- Use of linking words, prepositions, adjectives, quantifiers.

The emphasis will be on oral communication. Material will be introduced in the form of recording or written material and it will be explained and put into a communicative context.

Students will interact with each other to practise the language.

Students' practice will be supervised and when necessary help and clarification will be given

Reading and writing will be practised mainly as part of the individual learning at home.

What previous knowledge or skills do I need to have?

The course is for people who have completed Year 1 or have the same knowledge or have studied the language for about 60 hours

By the end of the course you will be able to:

Understand and communicate in everyday situations of same complexity when visiting the country.

What examination or assessment will there be and what will it involve?

There will not be an examination at the end of this course. A tutor conducted initial assessment will be followed by on-going assessment of progress and achievement.

How will I know I am making progress?

Your tutor will give you on-going feedback while on the course. You will have an individual learning plan to monitor your own progress, and you may also want to keep your own diary of your progress.

You will gain more from the course if you can commit study time to it outside the classroom. A half to one hour weekly is considered adequate, but you may want to allow more, to further aid your progress.

When I have finished the course, what can I progress to?

Your tutor can be approached for additional information and advice during the course. From this course you can progress to: the 'Intermediate Level' (GCSE Level Exam or Non Exam) which starts next year.

What do I need to bring to my first class?

You will need to bring some writing materials and the Enrolment Slip.

Is there anything else I need to know?

In general, we will not allow late entry to any course after the first two weeks. Short intensive courses and most workshops will not accept new learners after the first class. In all cases the full fee will be charged.

You can discuss issues with your tutor or his manager at any time during the course.

During the course you will also receive at least one satisfaction surveys to complete. This is used by us to monitor different aspects of the courses.
