
Thank you to our readers and shoppers

We raised over £1800 for the Local History Library & Archives, which is particularly welcome in our current economic climate. This year we added a second room of independent community stalls which was also very well-received - thanks to all who participated, and to Sanjida Alam and Robert Jones for organising everything at our end.

As the year draws to a close, we reflect on an extremely busy few months for us here on Bancroft Road. During November, over 250 visits were made to Tower Hamlets Local History Library & Archives and staff responded to 165 email/phone/postal enquiries. Over 800 items from the collections were consulted in the Reading Room or at one of our workshops or events. Nearly 900 people engaged with our service offer, whether visiting an exhibition or chatting to us at an offsite event. We've also been busy hosting KS2 workshops for Tower Hamlets school pupils visiting the Next Stop exhibition. More information on our schools work will follow in 2026!

Closing event: Talk by Jim Connor Thursday 12 February | evening tbc



Fielding Postcards is the latest book from the History of Wapping Trust. Published in memory of local historian Ray Newton, the book presents a unique set of 33 colour picture postcards sold by Watney Street newsagent Charles Fielding in the early 1900s. 
Yiddish digital archive launched

We are delighted to report the launch of a <u>new online resource</u> which presents an almost complete collection of the Yiddish literary journal *Loshn un lebn* (*Language and Life*) by influential Yiddish poet **A.N. Stencl**. This celebrated Yiddish literary magazine ran from 1940-1981 and was created and edited by poet Avrom Nokhem Stencl (1897-1983), also known as A.N. Stencl. It became the longest running foreign language journal in the UK.

Stencl was a native Yiddish speaker from Poland, who settled in London's East End in 1936 and became an activist and campaigner for the continuation of Yiddish culture. His extraordinary life spanned the height and demise of contemporary Yiddish culture and language, and he wrote about his experiences in his magazine. *Loshn un lebn* featured Stencl's own poems, essays and memoirs alongside an array of work by other Yiddish writers and poets exploring political, social and literary topics of the time.

The digital resource is the culmination of a two-year project, funded by British Academy Leverhulme Small Grant, where researchers tracked down and digitised copies of these long out-of-print Yiddish journals to create the largest publicly available collection worldwide with an index of content pages translated into English for non-Yiddish speakers.

We were very happy to be a partner on this project, working closely with Prof. Rachel Lichtenstein and Dr. Paul Darby to facilitate the digitisation of the 285 original copies of *Loshn un lebn* held here at Tower Hamlets Local History Library & Archives. **Explore** the online Stencl archive here.
