Introductory research sessions


Introduction to researching the history of communities | Thu 13 Nov, Sat 15 Nov Venue: Tower Hamlets Local History Library & Archives, Reading Room

Our latest exhibition **Next Stop** explores the fascinating history of public transport in the East End over nine centuries. Learn about the building of Bow Bridge in the 12th century, the opening of the Elizabeth Line in the 21st, and the Victorian innovations in steam and underground travel in between.

Showcasing over 100 unique items from the collections of Tower Hamlets Local History Library & Archives, the exhibition documents many changes and evolutions in public transport - tollgates, trolleybuses and trams included! The exhibition also features first-hand testimonies of people who have used or worked on different forms of public transport, past and present. Through newspaper cuttings, photographs, maps, oral history recordings and creative work, **Next Stop** aims to share both personal and archival knowledge about the history of public transport in the East End.

This is the first exhibition we have curated that is designed for both adults and children. An illustrated timeline, interactive games and artwork by local school pupils are all included in the exhibition, so the whole family can be entertained on their visit.


News from the Reading Room



Last week we welcomed Jeff Highfield, Chairman of the **Pensions Archive Trust** who visited us and viewed items from the council's early superannuation schemes as well as images and newsletters of local pensioners action groups.

Before the 20th century, pension provision for workers was limited - families were dependent on funds supplied by businesses or benevolent charities. Many people entered the local workhouses in old age and became dependent on parish poor relief.

<u>Pensions Archive Trust</u> is a charity formed in 2005 to ensure that important information about occupational pensions is not lost to history, but is retained and accessible to any who may need to learn from the successes and failures of the past.
