# Film screening: E1 Festival



Thursday 27 November | 6.00 - 7.30pm

Venue: Tower Hamlets Local History Library & Archives

Come along for an exclusive screening of the 1972 Man Alive documentary *Alright, We'll Do It Ourselves*, which explores the origins of Stepney's E1 Festival. Directed by Jenny Barraclough, this 50-minute film is a fascinating snapshot of Stepney in the early 1970s, and includes oral histories from local people, plus music from East End artists and footage of community events and activism.

This screening is a collaboration with <u>Four Corners</u> gallery, as part of their current exhibition <u>A World Apart: Photographing Change in London's East End, 1970-76</u>. The event will also feature a Q&A, plus a chance to view rare photographs of the 1972-73 festivals from our image collection, such as the one above of the 1973 festival by George Hubert-Jones (ref P18582). The event will be hosted by our Local History Librarian, Robert Jones, and Carla Mitchell from Four Corners.

**Note:** Our copy of the film was digitised from a VHS tape which unfortunately had an intermittent buzzing on the audio track. We hope this does not detract from your enjoyment of the film.

## A Season of Bangla Drama


Tower Hamlets Council's unique and acclaimed theatre festival returns this November and this year's theme is 'Kindness'. The festival showcases eleven new productions examining what kindness means from different perspectives. Themes include:

- kindness seen through the eyes of migrants
- the kindness of caring for our own wellbeing
- how kindness and empathy can have a positive impact in our communities, in both quiet unseen gestures as well as in rebellious acts.

The programme includes drama and comedy, conversation, music and songs. **A Season of Bangla Drama** champions new writing and provides a platform for debut performances which resonate with East London audiences. Performances are in a mixture of Bangla, Sylheti and English. The festival takes place 1 to 30 November with performances taking place at the Brady Arts Centre and Pinter Studios, QMUL. There is also a fringe programme of events including art workshops, exhibitions, talks and walks.
